Discussion Questions

Bill posed several questions for further thought near the end of the podcast. Consider these for further reflection.

“The what, who, when, where, why, and how of worship may best be considered as happening as one gives retrospective attention to an experience or experiences. . . .

- * Did the "Mystery" appear, even for just an instant?
- * Did a clearer perspective about life or some facet of life become apparent?
- * One gauge is to ask yourself, "Am I different, as a person, in regard to the right, good, and happy dimensions of life after this/these experience(s)?"

If you can answer in the affirmative, then you are on track to understanding worship as a centering experience of life” (Bill Tillman, The Integrity Wheel, p. 20).
